To this end, investments are being made in public transport, water services, tourism and important major projects.

Over €6m for tourism projects including €2m for tourism projects around Lough Derg as well as others at Limerick Riverside, the Burren Heritage Trail, Blackhead Driving Routes, the Burren Driving Route, King John's Castle and St. Mary's Cathedral



Transport



Almost €17m for sustainable transport initiatives including greenways and the development of cycling and walking strategies across towns and regions in Clare, Tipperary and Limerick and including €9m for the Limerick Smarter Travel project

A further €9.7m was allocated for transport projects in Limerick since 2011 with a €2m investment recently announced, €1.39m of which is allocated to Colbert Station

Housing



Almost €141m is allocated to provide 2,114 social homes in the region by 2017

€26m to provide 529 homes in County Clare

€57.8m to provide 753 homes in County Limerick

€57.1m to provide 832 homes in County Tipperary

Flood Defence



€430m is being provided for flood initiatives nationally to build on substantial investments made in recent years, for example in Clonmel and Ennis

The allocation for 2016 includes a provision of €52.5m for flood relief schemes nationally which includes schemes at Ennis South and Foynes, Co Limerick

Harbour Works



In 2015, funding of €353,176 has been paid in respect of harbour works at New Quay Pier, Gleninagh Pier, Kilkee Pier, Liscannor and Ballyvaughan Pier in Co Clare

Irish Water



Irish Water investment in water supply and waste water treatment schemes in the Mid West will be in excess of €73m under the Capital Investment Plan 2014 - 2016. In addition to the above, there will also be investments relating to Minor Capital Programmes

Broadband

The National Broadband Plan will be the most important public investment in rural Ireland and will provide high-speed broadband access to every home, school and business in Ireland by 2020, with 85% covered by 2018

The State intervention element of the plan will provide high-speed broadband access in areas where it is not commercial for private operators to invest alone

Formal procurement was launched at the end of 2015 with a view to awarding a contract(s) to build the necessary infrastructure towards the end of 2016
