Tourism, Sport & Regeneration



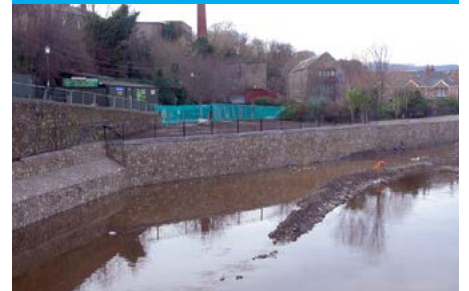
Over €6.3m for tourism projects at Dunleckney Maltings, St. Canice's Cathedral, the Medieval Mile, Hook Head, Ros Tapestry, the Norman Way and the Celtic Tree Experience

Over €18m has been allocated in sports capital and local authority swimming pool

funding for the South East since 2011, with €5.6m sports capital funding allocated to South East projects under the 2015 Sports Capital Programme

Development and regeneration of North Quays and the City Streetscape project in Waterford city

Flood Defence



€430m is being provided for flood initiatives including remedial and prevention works scheduled for Arklow, Bray, Enniscorthy and Waterford

Programme of works for 2016 will include the completion of the schemes at Bray and Waterford and advancement of the schemes at Arklow and Enniscorthy

Irish Water Investment



Irish Water investment in water supply and waste water treatment schemes in the South East will be in excess of €110m under the Capital Investment Plan 2014 -2016. In addition to the above, there will also be investments relating to Minor Capital Programmes

Broadband

The National Broadband Plan will be the most important public investment in rural Ireland and will provide high-speed broadband access to every home, school and business in Ireland by 2020, with 85% covered by 2018

The State intervention element of the plan will provide high-speed broadband access in areas where it is not commercial for private operators to invest alone

Formal procurement was launched at the end of 2015 with a view to awarding a contract(s) to build the necessary infrastructure towards the end of 2016

Harbour Works



Allocations for harbour works under way and due to take place:

€236,000 for Boatstrand South Pier, Helvick Pier and Cheekpoint Harbour

€1,326,132 for Wexford, Courtown, Cahore, Carne, Fethard, Slade, Duncannon, Kilmore Quay, New Ross

€120,615 for the Avoca River & Arklow Harbour
